ENGLISH

Students will be focusing on persuasive writing, developing effective structures and techniques. During the term, they will also be engaging in a unit concentrating on the concepts of media bias, perspective and representation, looking more closely at the text 'Azaria: A True Story'. Students will learn to analyse, read, and view a range of multimodal texts, that will also support these themes. They continue to develop their speaking and listening skills as they engage with a wide range of texts.





SCIENCE

Students will learn how digital systems function and the important roles they play in our lives. They will explore how digital systems collect, store, transmit and represent different types of data and how they connect to form networks. Students will investigate a number of digital systems and how they can be used to meet the needs of

communities. Students will investigate different types of energy and how they can be transferred and transformed. They will consider how electricity is essential to their daily lives and use practical science skills to investigate electrical circuits and perform an experiment to test a hypothesis.



YEAR 6 2022 TERM 2 OVERVIEW

PDHPE

Students will develop knowledge, understanding and skills to focus on their health, safety and wellbeing, while navigating transition and change in their lives. They will discuss emotions and how these affect their decisions, behaviours and relationships. Students will also develop an understanding of what a respectful relationship looks like and they will practise positive behaviours to enhance relationships. They will learn strategies to deal with conflict or bullying, and implement actions to maintain and improve the quality of an active lifestyle. Students will have the opportunity to develop the skill components required to participate in an athletics carnival and play a team

sport.

CAPA

Students will learn about the concepts in music by exploring different musical styles and genres. With a particular focus on organising, listening and performing sound, students will increase their knowledge through Australian inspired examples that link with our History focus for Term 2. Together students will compose and appreciate music in a culturally rich way.



MATHEMATICS

Students will be increasing their understanding of fractions and decimals, and how this connects when performing calculations with money. They will explore a range of mental and written strategies for the operations of addition and subtraction, and

multiplication and division. Further investigation of the measurement concepts of length and area will also be studied this term. Problem solving activities will allow students to apply these strategies and to discuss real world mathematics problems using key mathematical language.



HISTORY

Students will be investigating the origins of human rights and the continued effort to ensure all people are treated equally in Australia. Research will be conducted on the rights of women, children and indigenous Australians as well as the injustices faced by these groups in the past. The history of migration, reasons for migration and its importance in Australian history are also explored in this unit. At the end of the unit students will plan, prepare and present a research
