ENGLISH

Students will read and view persuasive texts in a range of formats, including advertising, posters, videos and picture books. They will analyse texts to understand the ways that authors use language and persuasive techniques to convince an audience. Students will create persuasive texts using a range of effective techniques. They will also continue to develop their skills in reading and will have a range of opportunities to enhance their speaking and listening skills.



SCIENCE

Students will study the Earth's relationship with the Sun and learn about the rotation of the Earth on its axis causing the patterns of night and day and seasons. Students will question, research, investigate and communicate their understanding. Elements of digital technology and design and production skills are incorporated into the lessons.



YEAR 3 2022 TERM 2 OVERVIEW

PDHPE

Students will learn about the importance of empathy, inclusion, and respect in relationships. They will examine behaviours and attitudes that build positive relationships and increased cultural understanding. In PE and Sport lessons, they will develop the skills and attitudes to participate in a range of team sports.



CAPA

This term, in creative arts lessons, students will be focusing on dance. They will explore the cultural context in which a range of dances came about, including bush dance, folk dance and cultural dance. They will perform and compose dances to explore rhythm, space, and a range of different movements.



MATHEMATICS

Students will explore concepts of whole number such as place value and develop their skills in the operations of multiplication and division using a range of strategies. They will order fractions and decimals and solve multistep word problems. In measurement and geometry, students will name and compare angles and measure length using metres and centimetres. They will explore a range of ways to represent data and the chance of events.



HISTORY

Students will examine the European exploration and colonisation of Australia and the world, up to the early 1800s. They will question, research, and analyse historical information and artefacts to gain an understanding of why and how the exploration took place. Students will reflect on the impact that colonisation had on
