YEAR 1 2020 TERM 1 OVERVIEW

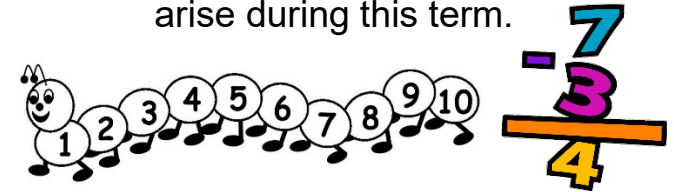
PDHPE

Students will learn to explain how it is important to understand our bodies and the importance of staying safe through our child protection lessons. Fundamental movement skills and modified games based on these skills make up the physical education component this term.



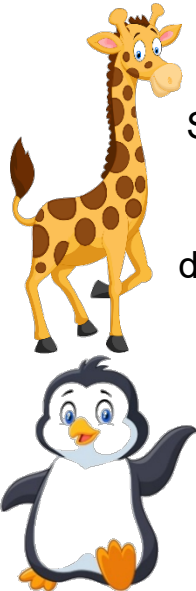
MATHEMATICS

Students will be exploring the topics of whole number concepts such as identifying numbers 1-50 as well as using them in number talks. Students will also be adding and subtracting numbers up to 20. Students will order numbers as well as create ways of representing these using MAB blocks and increasing their understanding of place value. Problem solving opportunities will also arise during this term.



SCIENCE

Students will be exploring the Living World strand of Science and will gain a deeper understanding on how animals survive in different environments. In addition, students will be examining growth and change via the exploration of life cycles using scientific language.



CAPA

Students will be taking part in lessons associated with music. These will be taught by our wonderful R.F.F teachers. Students will explore music composition as well as creating and listening to beats using body percussion and musical instruments.



HISTORY

Students will be looking at the unit Past and Present Family Life. Students will investigate the similarities and differences in family life by comparing what families do today to that of previous generations. Students will begin to explore the links and the changes that occur over time and are introduced to using historical sources in their learning.
