MATHEMATICS

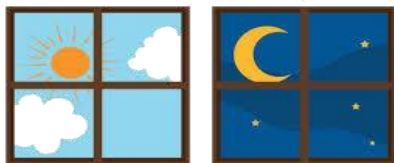
In Term 4, students will continue to work on addition and subtraction concepts. They will be looking at concepts of fractions, patterns and algebra and money. Measurement concepts such as time, mass and volume and capacity will be taught and this will link to their number skills. Maths talks and problem solving will continue to be developed this term.



SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

Students will continue to investigate patterns in the day and night sky. Investigations such as the changes to the sun and moon will be examined using scientific terms. Skills such as observing, sketching, ordering and predicting will be evident throughout this term.

CAPA
